Thursday 8th April 'New Shoots' 10am till 12 midday

You and your kid can learn about sowing seed to grow vegetables, salads, herbs and even edible flowers! You get to take away your own container of seeds to watch grow & care for.

• Monday 19th April 'Go Wild' 10am till 12 midday

Together you and your kid can learn about the importance of wildlife & habitats in the garden - go on a bug hunt, create a bug hotel and sow some wildflower seeds to help out honey bees, insects & birds.

• Tuesday 20th April 'Green Growers' 3.30pm till 5.30pm

SEASONAL TIPS

Hot tips this month...

Seed sowing has started on our heated mat but you could try on a warm windowsill....marigolds, sweetpeas, tomatoes, aubergine, french beans, lettuce, broccoli, brussels sprout, dill, parsley.





We've planted beetroot and carrots in toilet tubes cut in half as beetroot does not like to have its roots disturbed. Can then be transferred into outside bed which has been warmed up by being covered by a cloche.
