We had an evening celebrating the success of garden trainees, young and old, with a presentation ceremony in November where TV gardener Chris Collins did the honours. Trainees from different programmes received awards, certificates and diplomas in Practical Horticulture, which they achieved here at the garden

We have been working in partnership with Otesha, a charity fighting youth unemployment; Shoreditch Trust, running the Estate to Plate project; and City Bridge Trust's Growing Localities project which funds the New Leaf training for people with learning disabilities and experience of mental ill health. There were also a few trainees from our Wish You Well project funded by the Big Lottery's Ecominds strand. Students from these diverse groups were able to meet each other and share their experience, during the well-attended evening of great food and conversation. It was a lovely opportunity to recognise everyone's hard work.
